

SFMTA Statement to TJPA

(Issued November 9, 2020)

Starting Monday, November 9th, SFMTA crews began work on a new twoway protected bike lane on Beale Street between Market and Natoma. An extension of the two-way bike lane from Natoma to Howard streets and additional sidewalk widening on Beale Street will follow as signal work and OCS overhead line work for Muni is completed. Design work is underway for the two-way bikeway between Howard and Folsom streets as part of a development project to add housing and a new park. The twoway bikeway will connect to the soon-to-be completed streetscape project on Folsom Street east of 2nd Street. As the City gradually reopens, the SFMTA is implementing improvements like this one for San Franciscans to reach their destination using different modes of transportation and allow for more physical distancing. This work is in conjunction with the Active Beale Street Project. The work on the new bike lane will not affect the existing transit lane or access to the terminal.
