

**STAFF REPORT FOR CALENDAR ITEM NO.: 9
FOR THE MEETING OF: March 10, 2022**

TRANSBAY JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

On February 15, 2007, the TJPA Board of Directors approved the appointment of the fifteen inaugural members to the TJPA Citizens Advisory Committee (TJPA CAC). The inaugural CAC meeting was held in April 2007, and the newly appointed members drew lots to determine which would serve initial one-year terms and which would serve full two-year terms. The expiration of subsequent terms has been staggered accordingly. This year, seven regular seats and one mid-term seat on the committee are open to be filled.

The TJPA CAC bylaws specify that members be selected to represent the following constituent categories:

1. Daily Caltrain Rider into San Francisco
2. Daily AC Transit Transbay Rider into San Francisco
3. Daily MUNI Rider on a line that terminates at or passes through the Transbay Terminal
4. Local Resident from District 6
5. Local Business from District 6
6. Environmentalist
7. Member of a Planning or Good-Government Non-Profit Organization
8. Representative from Labor
9. Bicycle Advocate
10. Disabled Advocate
11. San Francisco Based Public Transit Advocate
12. Regional Transit Advocate
13. Regional Transit Advocate
14. Member of the Citywide (San Francisco) Business Community
15. Member with Expertise in Real Estate Development or Real Estate Finance

The criteria for membership were established to ensure a qualified committee of regional stakeholders with a diverse array of knowledge and interest/advocacy aligned with the principal components that define the Program. Membership requires affiliation with at least one category, and the bylaws further specify that this mix of representation be preserved when replacement members are appointed to the CAC. The TJPA solicited applications for new and returning members from January 2022 through February 2022. The TJPA received eleven (11) applications, including five (5) from current members who reapplied.

After reviewing all applications, staff is recommending that the Board of Directors reappoint five (5) members to the CAC and appoint two (2) new members to fill seven (7) of the eight open seats:

During the 2022 recruitment process, CAC member Bob Planthold, who sat in the disabled advocate seat, unexpectedly passed away resulting in a mid-term opening for the disabled advocate seat. TJPA folded in recruitment for this seat during this recruitment period; however, TJPA did not receive an application to fill the Disabled Advocate seat. We are conducting additional outreach to The Lighthouse and San Francisco Mayor's Office on Disability and stakeholders to encourage individuals qualifying for this seat to apply. TJPA will diligently continue outreach to fill this seat as soon as possible.

APPLICATION SOLICITATION OUTREACH

Prior to forming the CAC, TJPA staff developed, and the TJPA Board of Directors approved, an application for membership that asks for qualifications for membership, a statement of the applicant's objectives and goals, and affiliation(s) and references. This same application has been used in soliciting new members.

APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

The TJPA received 11 applications from seven men, two woman and two undeclared. Seven applicants are San Francisco residents, three are East Bay residents, and one is a North Bay resident. The applicants’ ethnicities are as follows: one is Asian Pacific Islander, five are Caucasian, one is Filipino, one is multi-ethnic, and three are undeclared.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE TJPA CAC

Staff recommends approval of candidates in seven indicated categories, pursuant to Article 2, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority Citizens Advisory Committee. The recommended members include five men, one woman, and one undeclared. The recommended applicants’ ethnicities are as follows: one is Asian Pacific Islander, three are Caucasian, one is Filipino, one is multi-ethnic, and one is undeclared. Four of the recommended applicants are San Francisco residents, two are East Bay residents and one is a North Bay resident.

NEXT STEPS

The attached resolution appoints seven recommended applicants for membership on the TJPA CAC. Appointed members will be contacted and invited to the next meeting of the TJPA CAC, which will be held on April 12, 2022. Due to the proclaimed state of emergency and as allowed by AB 361 as approved by the TJPA Board of Directors at their monthly meetings, CAC meetings are currently held remotely. Meetings are normally held at the TJPA office at 425 Mission Street, Suite 250, San Francisco, CA 94105.




