2. Staff Report (10 minutes)

Lily Madjus Wu, TJPA Communications and Legislative Affairs Director, presented the Staff Report.

Roland Lebrun asked for the staff report to be posted to the website and suggested that Closed Captioning be provided for CAC meetings.

3. Approval of Meeting Minutes: April 12, 2022

Secretary Larrick noted that with the recent practice of recording the CAC Meetings which are publicly available on the website, the minutes format has changed to be action focused.

Chair Larkin noted that his name was misspelled under Item 1 in the list of members present and Secretary Larrick acknowledged that it would be corrected.

There was no member of the public wishing to comment.

A motion to approve the amended minutes was made by Member Nachor and seconded by Chair Larkin. A majority voice vote approved the motion.

4. Presentation of draft budgets for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 (FY 22-23) Operating Budget in the amount of \$31,769,000 and FY 22-23 Capital Budget for Phase 1, Phase 2, and Tenant Improvements in an amount of \$116,507,000 and FY 22-23 Debt Service Budget in the amount of \$28,188,431 (20 minutes)

Oscar Quintanilla, TJPA Budget & Procurement Director, presented the item.

Member Nachor suggested that bus schedules be displayed on digital kiosks, and that transit map vending machines be available.

Alfonso Rodriguez, DTX Project Director, presented the item.

Roland Lebrun shared his understanding of the funding issues for the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority's BART extension into downtown San Jose.

9. CAC Member Comments & Future Agenda Requests

Secretary Larrick noted that the June 14, 2022 CAC meeting will be rescheduled for June 7, 2022 so that the meeting precedes the June 9, 2022 TJPA Board meeting. He stated that a special meeting notice would be forthcoming.

Member Wong requested an overview of all projects surrounding the Salesforce Transit Center.

Member Stull requested an update of the current status and future plans for the former Temporary Terminal site, now known as The Crossing, which Member Robinson agreed to coordinate.

Future agenda requests include: 1) train doors and platform heights for DTX; 2) review of bus and traffic circulation in the area surrounding the Transit Center and update on SFMTA service changes; 3) update on digital signage; 4) AC Transit update on reinstating the Bus Only Lane on the Bay Bridge; 5) SF Planning update on Southeast Railyard Station Study and Pennsylvania Avenue Extension (PAX); 6) overview of construction projects surrounding the Salesforce Transit Center; and 7) update on the redevelopment of The Crossing.
