

CONNECTING YOUR VETERAN BENEFITS WITH YOUR APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING

You can collect your GI benefits as a registered apprentice. This benefit offers veterans the flexibility to receive an education on-the-job rather than formal classroom instruction. Veterans who become registered apprentices in an approved apprenticeship program can use their GI Bill benefit and receive a tax free stipend.

Remember to consider your previous military experience while applying. Your previous training and acquired skill may qualify you for advanced placement or preferential consideration during the application process.
