TRANSBAY JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

On February 15, 2007, the TJPA Board of Directors approved the appointment of the fifteen inaugural members to the TJPA Citizens Advisory Committee (TJPA CAC). The inaugural CAC meeting was held in April of 2007, and the newly appointed members drew lots to determine which would serve initial one year terms and which would serve full two year terms. The expiration of subsequent terms has been staggered accordingly. This year eight seats on the committee are open to be filled.

The TJPA CAC bylaws specify that members be selected to represent the following constituent categories:

- 1. Daily Caltrain Rider into San Francisco
- 2. Daily AC Transit Transbay Rider into San Francisco
- 3. Daily MUNI Rider on a line that terminates at or passes through the Transbay Terminal
- 4. Local Resident from District 6
- 5. Local Business from District 6
- 6. Environmentalist
- 7. Member of a planning or good-government non-profit organization
- 8. Representative from labor
- 9. Bicycle advocate
- 10. Disabled advocate
- 11. San Francisco based public transit advocate
- 12. Regional transit advocate
- 13. Regional transit advocate
- 14. Member of the citywide (San Francisco) business community
- 15. Member with expertise in real estate development or real estate finance

The criteria for membership were established to ensure a qualified committee of regional stakeholders with a diverse array of knowledge and interest/advocacy aligned with the principal components that define the Program. Membership requires affiliation with at least one category, and the bylaws further specify that this mix of representation be preserved when replacement members are appointed to the CAC.

The TJPA solicited applications for new and returning members between February 2014 and March 2014. The TJPA received fourteen applications including five current members who reapplied.

After reviewing all applications, staff is recommending that the Board of Directors reappoint five members to the CAC and appoint three new members to fill eight seats:

APPLICATION SOLICITATION OUTREACH

Prior to forming the CAC, TJPA staff developed, and the TJPA Board of Directors approved, an application for membership that asks for qualifications for membership, a statement of the applicant's objectives and goals, and affiliation(s) and references. This same application has been used in soliciting new members.

The call for applications was posted on the TJPA website at www.transbaycenter.org/cac, distributed via e-mail to the 1,850 people on the TJPA outreach list, discussed at CAC meetings, circulated through SFMTA, AC Transit, and Caltrain, shared with TJPA Board members, published in citywide and community newspapers, and distributed to various community organizations including:

Finally, applications were available at the TJPA Office. The TJPA received applications at the office in person, via US Postal Service, and e-mail.

APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

The TJPA received fourteen applications from eight men and six women. Seven applications are San Francisco residents, four are from the East Bay, two are from Marin, and one lives on the Peninsula. The applicants included three African American, three Hispanic, seven Caucasian and one undeclared (did not indicate ethnicity).

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE TJPA CAC

The Staff recommends approval of candidates in the eight indicated categories, pursuant to Article 2, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority Citizens Advisory Committee. The recommended members include four men and four women. Two applicants are African American, three are Hispanic, two are Caucasian and one is not declared. Four of the recommended applicants are San Francisco residents, one is from Alameda County, one is from Contra Costa County, one is from San Mateo County, and one is from Marin County.

NEXT STEPS

The attached resolution appoints the eight recommended applicants for membership on the TJPA CAC. Appointed members will be contacted and invited to the next meeting of the TJPA CAC, which will be held on May 13, 2014 at the TJPA offices at 201 Mission Street, Suite 2100.

Summary of Qualifications

My name is Pascale Soumoy, I am a Bay Area native, a regional planner and a member of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA) Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC). I have a Master's degree in Community and Regional Planning, 16 years professional planning experience and am very committed to collaborative community involvement with regards to land use and design of public spaces. As a daily commuter between Marin and San Francisco I am interested in and impacted by the local and regional influence of the Transbay Transit Center (TTC), I would very much like to continue my participation in the CAC as the planning/good government representative.

Statement of Objectives and Goals

During my four years as member of the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) I have witnessed the inauguration of the temporary bus terminal, the last days of the former Transbay Terminal, the excavation of the train-box and foundation of the new Transbay Transit Center (TTC), the drilling of micro-piles, installation of the steel bracing, the pouring of the concrete shoring walls and more recently the floors of the sub-basement.

As a planner witnessing the changes taking place in the Bay Area I can't help but notice the micro and macro actions involved in the balancing act of land use development. Being part of the TJPA process gives me an opportunity to have an inside look at the hundreds of decisions made in order to authorize, fund, design, construct and manage civic projects. My objective is to learn as much as I can about the TTC development process in the next two years; keep up with regional business and economic changes, urban design innovations and development trends; and in doing so contribute to the CAC.

TJPA is entering a more visible phase of neighborhood-development: towers have been designed, developers chosen and already the marketing has begun. One recent business journal article referred to the emerging TJPA neighborhood as the one that will rival the Mission and Marina neighborhoods as the place of choice for young up-and-comers living and working in San Francisco. San Francisco is facing increasing growth pressures due to a fast-growing demand for commercial space and market rate and affordable housing. The push for redevelopment is being felt not only in the TJPA neighborhood but also in the nearby mid-Market neighborhood, Mission Bay, and Hunter's Point neighborhoods. This trend is impacting other parts of the Bay Area as well, increasing the need for city-wide, as well as trans-bay and trans-county transportation and use of temporary TTC facilities.

Being involved with the TJPA as it balances such demands with the needs of its existing residents and businesses stakeholders is a unique opportunity to witness and contribute to important changes taking place in San Francisco and the region. TJPA has already proven resilient during the recession, and its flexibility will now include adapting to the emerging alternatives to public transit – Google shuttles and ferries, private companies providing services for their employees normally available through the public sector. I see TJPA and TTC as the bridge between traditional public transportation and the new reality of Zipcar, Citi-bike, private shuttles and app-driven car services. I am very interested in the new paradigm of these modes co-existing with the TTC and its stakeholders. Will they be seen as complimentary to the transit systems of the TTC or oppositional?

To me, being a CAC member means being aware of these influences and opportunities. I want to support TJPA staff in their efforts to keep this complex project on schedule and on budget in the face of economic pressures, the parallel construction of the Central Subway, the continued uncertainties of the California High Speed Rail project and the often-changing environment of San Francisco. I am inspired by the diversity of interests represented by the CAC and look forward to working with fellow members to offer feedback to TJPA staff and project managers. It has been an honor to serve on the committee, please accept my application to remain on the TJPA CAC for a third term.
